I.	<ul> <li>CEP</li> <li>Prepare for 2021-2022</li> <li>Must write an extended CEP</li> <li>Academic goals are written and based on prior state test results <ul> <li>These are optional so will not receive a full view of every student</li> <li>We will have to see what we will be basing these goals on</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
II.	<ul> <li>Budget Adjustments</li> <li>At first in a deficit but paid back most of it <ul> <li>Received Covid emergency funds to hire substitutes</li> <li>Midyear: Deficit of almost 300K</li> <li>February 25% return- deficit of 220K</li> </ul> </li> <li>All schools held harmless for deficit, now we have a healthy budget <ul> <li>Allowed to roll over money -about 32K</li> <li>Mayor announced the city will give all schools 100% of what is due of fair student funding, looking for more funding</li> </ul> </li> <li>In sum: was very bleak and now we are doing well, politicians are committing to giving money to schools</li> </ul>
III.	<ul> <li>Spring Opt-in to in-person learning</li> <li>Deadline passed</li> <li>Coming back 4/26</li> <li>Able to offer all remaining blended classes 5 days a week</li> <li>Had to create 4<sup>th</sup> pre-k class</li> </ul>
IV.	<ul> <li>Updated Safety &amp; Health Guidelines</li> <li>If anyone tests positive, class still needs to quarantine</li> <li>Changes- went into effect April 12:</li> </ul>

- 2 cases in a building that were not linked then could shut entire school before, now they would raise the percentage of students and staff who get randomly tested on a weekly basis
- 4 or more confirmed cases in different classrooms that can be traced to the school- then school may be shut down
- No longer closed for 24 hours for an investigation to take place

  - Deadline was 4/15
    - Created testing schedule, groups will receive their ELA exam Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday
    - 85 students are taking the state exams (including 10 remote students)
