Harper: I hold the door open for my friends.



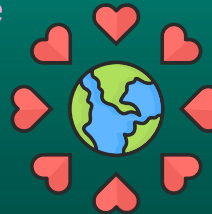
MM: How does being kind make you feel? Why?

Harper: When my friends bought me a surprise!

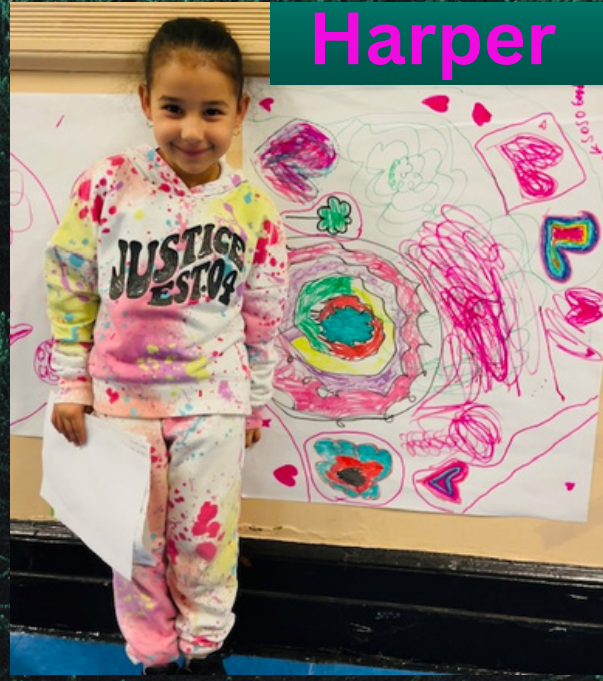


MM: Why do you think there's a World Kindness Day?

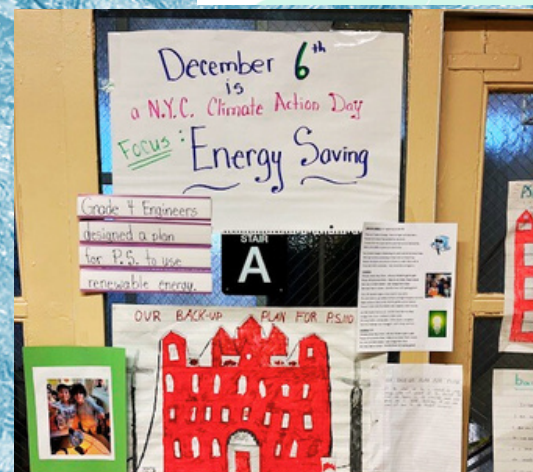
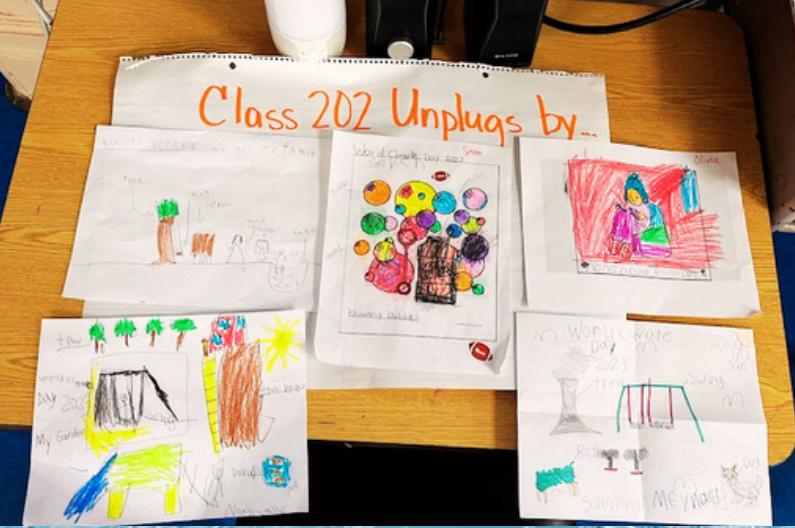


At our elementary energy

I'm writing this letter because our earth is being poluted and the global temperature will go up to 1.5° and 4.8° celcius.

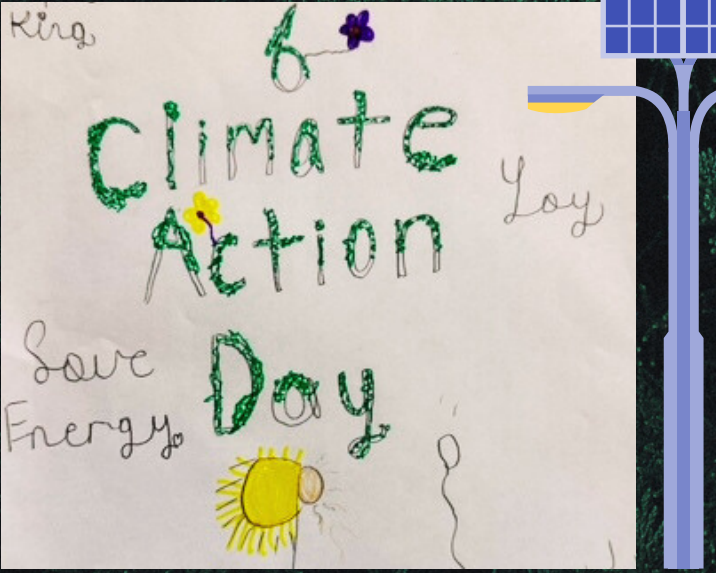

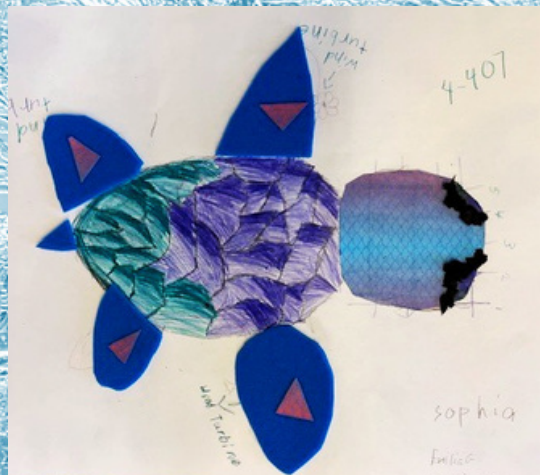
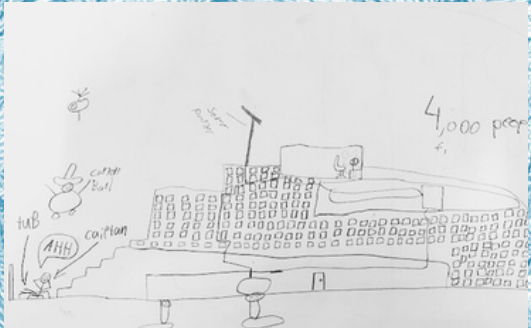
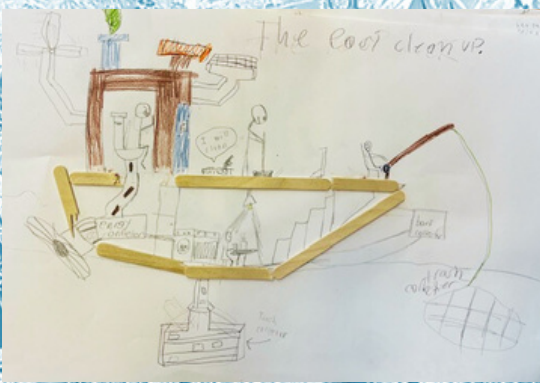
On December 6th it is Energy Saving Day and it is a special day for all schools in our city.

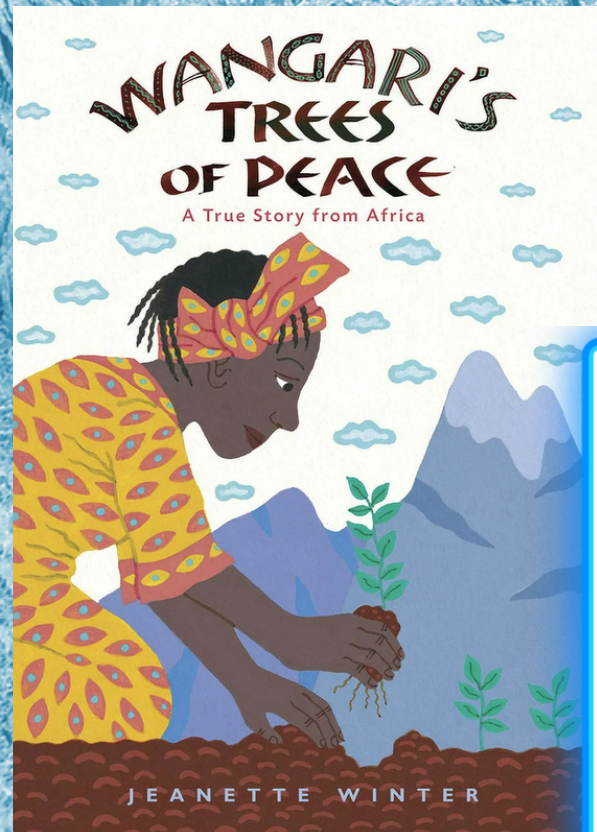
