#### Open Forum

- A parent asked if we can remove chocolate milk from being offered in the cafeteria. Ms. Raciunas answered that it is likely that the DOE is going to remove chocolate milk from all schools in the near future and we would begin to phase it out in our school soon.
- A parent suggested the money pledged from Assemblyman Lentol (\$125,000 at our last meeting) plus Participatory Budget money - pooled together to build a kitchen in 108.
- Concerns that not all students get all clusters (we have six clusters and only five days in a week, so not every student gets everything...) Ms Raciunas explained that our students all

get so much enrichment - through classes, enrichment clusters, art residencies, and more - so if we look at the whole experience at PS 110, all students do in fact get a rich experience.

- A parent asked how often the Pre-K classrooms are being cleaned. She had observed that the bathroom of her daughter's classroom was not clean and smelled strongly. Ms. Raciunas answered that they are cleaned twice a day and the staff works hard to keep them clean.
- A suggestion that as an eco school, we look at all we are doing to see what our environmental impact is - for example, at events, with merchandise, etc. We spoke of the work that the Wellness & Sustainability is doing.
